Introduction.

snəweyəł leləm Langara College's second Academic Plan builds on the work completed and the lessons learned through our inaugural Academic Plan, launched in 2016. The efforts of all Langarans over the past five years informed the Academic Plan Working Groups (APAG) initiatives, a few of which included:

- a proactive focus on our students;
- a continuing commitment to effective teaching and learning;
- the development of the Office of Indigenous Education and Services;
- the creation of the Centre for Intercultural Engagement; and,
- an application to the STARS program for sustainability.

These and other APAG initiatives provided a framework for working together effectively across priorities. Through them we were able to measure and celebrate our achievements from 2016 until today at Langara's annual APAG Conferences.

In this new Academic Plan, the prescriptive pillars that supported the first Plan are gone. Instead, we employ the metaphor of a kaleidoscope, whose changing colours and shapes foster innovation and collaboration in our academic pursuits.

This new Academic Plan will help us create a sense of belonging for students, faculty, and staff at Langara, the Pathways College. As we welcome new students to our campus, we acknowledge them as unique individuals and we commit to guiding and supporting them to achieve their goals. Our faculty and staff lean into this commitment at every opportunity and the College recognizes and proudly celebrates the unique culture that they create and share with new students each and every term.

We began in October 2019 to work towards our new Academic Plan, generating rich dialogue through consultations, facilitated discussions, surveys, and written feedback from faculty, students, and staff. Our Musqueam partners have been integral to the conversation from the beginning as we travel forward in this work together. This Academic Plan was developed to be flexible while maintaining clarity of purpose. We commit to working together to continue to champion excellence in our academic programming. - Social and cultural opportunities that shape students into globally aware citizens.






CURIOSITY, CREATIVITY, AND INNOVATION: CREATE THE FUTURE TOGETHER
