# **Course Description, Prerequisites, Corequisites:**

Students are introduced to the fundamentals of media-based studio practice. Open to all experience levels, the course offers a practical and conceptual foundation in digital processes while allowing for the critical investigation of authorship, appropriation and remix culture. Through a variety of activities, projects, and group and individual critiques, students develop a critical media vocabulary while developing skills in analysis and production that aim to foster a rich engagement with contemporary culture and digital practice.

Prerequisites: One of LET with a minimum Level 3; LPI with a minimum 26 on the essay and one of 5 in English usage, 5 in sentence structure, or 10 in reading comprehension; BC English 12 or equivalent with a minimum 80%; BC English Literature 12 with a minimum 80%; BC English First Peoples 12 with a minimum 80%; a university-level English or Communications course for which Langara awards transfer credit, with a minimum 'C-'; or 'C' in ENGL 1120, or an 'S' in one of ENGL 1107, 1108, or 1110.

## Corequisites:

Priority registration given to students admitted to the Diploma in Fine Arts program

# **Learning Outcomes:**

Upon successful completion of this course, students will be able to:

- Comfortably navigate a Mac environment and produce studio work in a variety of industrystandard software
- Successfully scan, photograph and collect digital samples or other found materials as input
- Recontextualize inputs in a software environment
- Output works in creative ways including printing, time-based media and installations
- Produce and critique works to demonstrate an awareness of art historical and contemporary practices around collage, appropriation and remix culture
- Create projects that expand on their creative processes and bodies of work
- Apply media to spatial, experiential or durational works of art
